# **OFFICIAL MINUTES**

## REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING BOARD OF EDUCATION

April 10, 2008 Board Room

**STUDY/DIALOGUE SESSION:** The Board of Education met at 5 p.m. in the Seminar Room to review the draft executive summary budget for 2008-2009. The superintendent and chief financial officer responded to Board member questions and will revise the draft budget as directed.

#### 1. **PRELIMINARY**

- 01. **CALL TO ORDER:** A regular meeting was called to order by Scott Benefield, President of the Board of Education, at 6:09 p.m. in the Board Room of the Education Services Center, 1829 Denver West Drive, Golden, Colorado, Thursday, April 10, 2008. Recess was held from 7:00-7:07 p.m.
- 02. **WELCOME TO THE AUDIENCE:** Mr. Benefield welcomed the audience and acknowledged the musical performance by students at Coronado Elementary, led by Steve Soich.
- 03. **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:** At the invitation of Mr. Benefield, the assembly repeated the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 04. **ROLL CALL:** Roll call indicated that the Board was present in its entirety Scott Benefield, President; Jane Barnes, First Vice President; Dave Thomas, Second Vice President; Sue Marinelli Secretary; and Vince Chowdhury, Treasurer. Cynthia Stevenson, Superintendent, represented the administration.

2. HONORS AND RECOGNITION: Students were honored for their excellence in music, dance, literature, photography, and visual arts in the PTA's annual "Reflections" program. Dance, kindergarten to second grade, Sophia Graves and Michelle Bradley, silver medalists; grades 3 to 5, Nichole Shannon, gold medalist; Francesca Rubin and Samantha McConnell, silver medalists; grades 6 to 8, Cammie Shedd, silver medalist. Literature, kindergarten to second grade, Sophie Matthews, gold medalist; and grades 6 to 8, Parker Simmons, silver medalist. Photography, kindergarten to second grade, Ben Schrag, gold medalist; grades 3 to 5, Olivia LeBlanc and Gillian Lloyd, gold medalists; grades 6 to 8, Anastasia Sanger, silver medalist. Visual Arts, kindergarten to second grade, Alexis Tolbert, gold medalist; grades 3 to 5, Grace Tolbert, gold medalist; grades 6 to 8, Abigail Fester, gold medalist; and Hannah Hebberd, silver medalist.

Travis Himmelman, freshman at Conifer High School, along with his coach Andrew Ubben, was recognized for winning the state 4A wrestling championship. Nick Jones, senior at Pomona High School, and his coach Pat DeCamillis were also recognized for winning the state 5A wrestling title.

Kevin Williams, senior at D'Evelyn, along with his coach Micah Porter, was honored for taking fifth place in the USA Jr. Men's World Cross Country Trials held in San Diego which earned him the right to compete in Edinburgh, Scotland as a member of the U.S. Junior World Cross Country team. Kevin placed 34<sup>th</sup> and was the third American to finish the race.

Twenty schools were recognized for the major role their school libraries have played in helping students achieve high academic standards. Conifer Senior, Elk Creek Elementary, Maple Grove Elementary, Semper Elementary, Sheridan Green Elementary, and Stott Elementary were honored for being High Performing libraries. Bell Middle, Campbell Elementary, Columbine Hills Elementary, Foothills Elementary, Ken Caryl Middle, Leawood Elementary, Marshdale Elementary, Pomona Senior, Ralston Elementary, Sierra Elementary, Warder Elementary, West Jefferson Elementary, Wheat Ridge Senior, and Warren Tech were honored for being Developing libraries.

Kevin Carroll, principal at Dunstan Middle School, was recognized as the Colorado Association of Libraries' outstanding school administrator. Su Eckhardt from the library association presented Mr. Carroll with the award.

Members of the Ralston Valley High School girls swimming and diving team were recognized for winning back-to-back 4A state championships. Swimmer Katie Johnson was recognized for finishing first place in the 200 Individual Medley and second place in the 500 Freestyle.

Members from Deer Creek Middle School's Team Babazeka presented the Board with an overview of their future city. The team won the Colorado Region Future City competition and traveled to the National Engineer's Week Future City competition in Washington D.C.

Dr. Stevenson mentioned the district had purchased art from the elementary and middle schools art shows and would be purchasing from the high school art show. She also encouraged the audience to attend the middle school art show at the Lakewood Cultural Center.

Mr. Benefield recognized the boy scouts who were in the audience to earn their merit badge. He also reported meeting with the Region 5 school board presidents.
